New applicants will begin receiving THE LEADING EDGE (TLE) in print and online access to GEOPHYSICS and TLE upon receipt and payment processing of this application. Dues for the next calendar year's renewal will be prorated to compensate for non-receipt of an entire year's journals. Journals distributed prior to becoming a member may be purchased through the SEG Book Order Department in the same manner as other individual orders. Membership of an applicant accepted on or after October 1 will begin with January 1 of the succeeding calendar year and the first dues payment will be applied to that year.

Membership Directory (Yearbook)

All members who receive THE LEADING EDGE will receive a CD-ROM version of the SEG Yearbook. Members who would like to receive a printed copy of the Yearbook must indicate this on the reverse side of this application and pay an additional US\$25.

Code of Ethics (English)

The Constitution of the SEG, Article IV, Section 1, states that "Membership of any class shall be contingent upon conformance with the established principles of professional ethics."

As an elaboration of these established principles of professional ethics, the following Code of Ethics is enunciated. It shall be your duty as a geophysicist, in order to maintain the dignity of your chosen profession:

1. To carry on your professional work in a spirit of fidelity to clients and employers, fairness to employees and contractors, and devotion to high ideals of personal honor.
2. To treat as confidential your knowledge of the business affairs, geophysical or geological information, or technical processes of clients or employers when their interests require secrecy.

3. To inform a client or employer of any business connections, interests or affiliations which might influence your judgment or impair the disinterested quality of your services.

4. To accept financial or other compensation for a particular service from one source only, except with the full knowledge and consent of all interested parties.

5. To refrain from associating yourself with, or knowingly to allow the use of your name by, an enterprise of questionable character.

6. To advertise only in a manner consistent with the dignity of the profession, to refrain from using any improper or questionable methods of soliciting professional work, and to decline to pay or to accept compensation for work secured by such improper or questionable methods.

7. To refrain from using unfair means to win professional advancement, and to avoid injuring unfairly, or maliciously, directly or indirectly, another geophysicist's professional reputation, business, or chances of employment.

8. To cooperate in building up the geophysical profession by the interchange of general information and experience with your fellow geophysicists and with students and also by contributions to the work of technical societies, schools of applied science, and the technical press.

9. To interest yourself in the public welfare, and to be ready to apply your special knowledge, skill, and training in the public behalf for the use and benefit of mankind.

Código de Ética Profesional (Español)

La Constitución de la Sociedad de Geofísicos de Exploración (SEG), Artículo IV, Sección 1, enuncia que "la calidad de miembro en cualquiera de las clases de asociación es condicional a la conformidad con los principios establecidos de ética profesional".

El siguiente Código de Ética Profesional se enuncia como elaboración de estos principios. Será su obligación como geofísico y a fin de mantener la dignidad de su profesión:

1. Conducirse profesionalmente en un espíritu de fidelidad a clientes y empleadores, honradez con clientes y contratistas, y devoción a altos ideales y honor personal.

2. Tratar de forma confidencial su conocimiento sobre asuntos de negocios, información geofísica o geológica, o procesos técnicos de clientes o empleados cuando los intereses de los mismos lo requieran.

3. Informar al cliente o empleador de conexiones, intereses o afiliaciones de negocios que pudieran influenciar su juicio o comprometer la calidad desinteresada de sus servicios.

4. Aceptar compensación financiera o de otra clase por un servicio dado de sólo una fuente, excepto con pleno conocimiento y consentimiento de todas las partes interesadas.

5. Abstenerse de asociarse a una empresa de dudosa reputación o permitir que la misma use su nombre con su conocimiento.

6. Anunciarse sólo de manera consistente con la dignidad de la profesión, abstenerse de usar medios impropios o dudosos de solicitar trabajo profesional, y rehusar a pagar o aceptar compensación por trabajo conseguido a través de esos medios.

7. Abstenerse de usar medios inequitativos de obtener promociones profesionales y evitar perjudicar injusta o maliciosamente, directa o indirectamente, la reputación profesional, el negocio o las oportunidades de empleo de otro geofísico.

8. Ayudar a elevar la profesión geofísica a través del intercambio de información general y experiencia con sus colegas geofísicos y con estudiantes, y también mediante contribuciones a la labor de sociedades técnicas, facultades de ciencias aplicadas y a la prensa técnica.

9. Mantenerse interesado en el bienestar público y estar dispuesto a aplicar sus conocimientos, habilidades y estudios especiales para el uso y beneficio de la humanidad.
